Liverpool CFO Activity Hub

#### Overview

CFO Activity Hubs support unemployed people (18 yrs and over) on probation, and in the 90 days post-sentence, to help participants overcome barriers into work, and support their desistance and reintegration into their local communities. Because participation in an Activity Hub is voluntary, providers need to ensure their services are seen by their target group as supportive, and responsive to their needs, if they are to engage effectively with them. Interventions Alliance (IA) feel their Liverpool Activity Hub is an example of best practice in working with offenders convicted of terrorism related offences (TACT offenders), in terms of both engaging what can be a particularly hard-to-reach, complex, and challenging group, and the way they work with, and complement the work of, staff from the NPS National Security Division, to ensure their effective management and supervision.

## Its impact

IA believe that the Liverpool Activity Hub plays an important role in assisting the management and reintegration of TACT offenders and others convicted of especially serious offences.

# What's special about it

It is the expertise the team have developed in engaging this group of offenders, and the collaborative working relationship they have forged with NPS National Security Division, that IA feel mark this service out.

### Wider applicability

IA believe that the approach taken within Liverpool Activity Hub could be of benefit in the way TACT offenders are managed and engaged not only in other CFO Activity Hubs, but also potentially more widely.
