## Name of project / initiative

Women's Trauma Informed Community Healthcare Project

#### Overview

The Women's Trauma Informed Community Healthcare Project is a joint project between Sandwell & Dudley Probation, the NHS, and Black Country Women's Aid. It seeks to address the fact that many women – including many of those in contact with probation – struggle to get their healthcare needs adequately met, often because they have other competing priorities preventing them prioritising their own health. The project provides nurse-led support and advice funded by the NHS, with ongoing referral as required. The service is provided within a women's centre run by Black Country Women's Aid, where the women can also access a range of other services. While the service is open to all women, most of those making use of it do so through their engagement with Sandwell and Dudley NPS.

### Its impact

Sandwell & Dudley believe that the service provides an effective way to ensure that hard-toreach women get the healthcare support and advice that they need and would otherwise not get.

# What's special about it

It is the collaborative nature of the project, the fact that it is located alongside other women's services, and the additional time, and personalised, trauma-informed care and support that the project nurse is able to provide, that makes this stand out.

### Wider applicability

The project has minimal cost to probation, and could potentially be rolled out more widely, subject to the support of local NHS services.
